



### Chairman's Comments

Welcome to the fourth Bagillt Community newsletter, this is the second since I was elected Chairman in May 2008. I hope you will enjoy reading the content.

Following positive feedback from local residents, the Community Council has decided to continue producing a further edition with the intention on this occasion to give local organisations the opportunity of advertising their service and given the time of the year to give notice of events for the festive season. In this edition we will also welcome the new Vicar of Bagillt, the Reverend Sarah Hildreth, have articles from Ysgol Merilyn and Ysgol Glan Aber, as well as information on other local organisations and the keep Well this Winter Campaign from the National Public Health Service for Wales.

Since the last newsletter the two new seats have been erected at the War Memorial in the High Street with co-operation between the Council and the Heritage Society to complement the work done by the latter on this site. Christmas lighting is again being provided in the centre of the village with the co-operation of the owners of the premises for which the Council is extremely grateful. It had been hoped to extend the lighting scheme for 2008 into the Boot End, but this has not proved possible although it is hoped it maybe possible in the future. The Council is supporting the local County Councillor in seeking to have a pedestrian crossing in the vicinity of the shops in the High Street to aid public safety and also a new bus shelter on the Riverbank side of the Holywell Road. The Council has agreed to co-operate with Flintshire County Council to produce a Community Emergency Plan and will be seeking the assistance of members of the public in producing and updating the document.

I should like to take this opportunity on behalf of the Community Council to wish everyone a very merry Christmas and a happy New Year.

### Focus on a local person - Reverend Sarah Hildreth - Vicar of Bagillt

I was born and bred in Denbigh where my parents still live. I was ordained in the Church in Wales at St. Asaph Cathedral 3 years ago and since then have spent my time serving in the Parish of Hawarden. Prior to Ordination I worked at Ysgol Plas Brondyffryn, Denbigh, a school for children with Autistic Spectrum Disorders. I enjoyed my time there immensely working alongside the staff and children. As well as working at school I was a Project Worker for Flintshire Social Services.

The Church at this time faces a huge challenge - modernisation and change! I wouldn't be a Christian never mind a Priest if I didn't believe that God and the Church had so much to offer all people regardless of who we are, where we live etc., but sadly God has come to be viewed as out of date and not really relevant for today. Many people still view God as one who is "the Boss" who is over us and wants to rule us. To some degree this is true but in Jesus God shows us clearly that he wants to walk with us, loving us, caring for us, guiding us, helping us. We see that so clearly during the Christmas season God comes among us and lives as one of us.

Working in a primary school is in many ways a unique experience. It is an opportunity to form the future of our community and beyond by providing the children of Bagillt with the skills and attitudes for life, they will so dearly need.

At Ysgol Merllyn we value the richness that participation in activities can offer and try like many schools to broaden the minds of the youngsters in our care. This year we have organised two highly successful arts projects that have included all of our children and their families working together. The first was a celebration of artwork created at home and at school and displayed at Theatr Clwyd art gallery for approximately two months. We followed this event with our own school art gallery where every child had a painting or drawing framed professionally and displayed in the school hall.

Enjoyable as these exhibitions were we continue to look to the future and will soon become immersed in our Bagillt art project. Our children will have the chance to work with staff from Merllyn and Flint High Schools to capture our village buildings in the style of Cefyn Burgess. Bagillt has some marvellous architecture and during this school year the children will be creating another exhibition of their work at Theatr Clwyd.

As Headteacher of Ysgol Merllyn I will be hoping to establish this 'Picture of Bagillt' in a local venue as well, so that local people can see their village in art as they go about their daily activities. I will publish details of this exhibition as soon as they are confirmed. Fingers crossed, we might even tempt Cefyn to join us. See you there!

### National Public Health Service for Wales - Keep Well this Winter in Flintshire

A quick reference guide for people over 60 and those who care for them on who to contact for support and advice on keeping warm and well during the winter months. Health through warmth - Proper insulation and draught-proofing will make your home warmer and could reduce your bills by up to a half. There are free measures for anyone over 60. North Wales Energy Advice Centre provides advice on insulation, heating grants, getting the most from the energy you use and finding the best value gas and electricity supplier for you. Please contact the Advice Centre on 0800 954 0658 quoting KWTW, for free and impartial advice . . . . .

Staying safe in your home - If you are contacted by someone offering you insulation or heating services do not enter any contract before contacting the Energy Advice Centre. Remember the law says that in most cases a trader must give you 7 days cooling off period before starting any work.
